

National Theatre Amadeus [Sunday 4/2 | 2:00 pm | \$12/\$10 members | 3 hours | theater, drama] Vienna: the music capital of the world. Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, a rowdy young prodigy, arrives determined to make a splash. Awestruck by his genius, court composer Antonio Salieri has the power to promote his talent or destroy it. Seized by obsessive jealousy he begins a war with Mozart, with music and, ultimately, with God.

White Nose Symposium [Tuesday, April 4 | 4:30 pm | FREE admission] The Williams Lake Project is thrilled to present the White Nose Symposium co-sponsored by the Rondout-Esopus Land Conservancy. Leading experts and researchers in the field, Carl Herzog, Alan Hicks, Michael S. Fishman, and Dr. Craig Frank, will discuss cutting-edge research on white nose syndrome and endangered bats, including results from a research study currently being conducted on the Williams Lake property. The property is critical habitat for the bats, now forever protected land under a permanent conservation easement.
